Plant native plants



① By planting native plants, we provide to animals - such as this western meadowlark and her eggs.

② Sagebrush, a native plant in Wyoming, can provide shelter for small animals such as this mouse.



③ The Sagebrush also provides a place for sage grouse to live and be protected.



④ This white-tailed deer is able to thrive because of the western wheat grass. A grass native to Wyoming.
